Fees Free

Fees-free is a NZ Government policy to help people begin their tertiary education. If you are eligible, up to \$12,000 of your fees will be free in your first year including tuition fees and compulsory course costs. This policy applies to any of our programmes or courses at Level 3 to Level 5 or starting out on a bachelor's degree programme. You will need to know your National Student Number (NSN) to check if you are eligible.



Master of Information **Technology**

Having driven trucks on New Zealand roads for over two decades, Mike Woolley plans to put his new master's degree in IT to good use and eventually find a niche job in the transport industry.

The Auckland father of five first discovered AIS by researching IT programmes on the internet. He was offered a scholarship for his first year and liked the idea of the small class sizes on offer.

"I first started at AIS in 2015, studying towards the Bachelor of Information Technology. During my final year I found out that the following year they were offering the Postgraduate Diploma in Information Technology, so I decided to continue my study in the new programme on the research pathway. I knew there would be a master's degree offered the final year, and I wanted to study under Dr Mike Watts specifically. I now hold a Master of Information Technology specialising in Artificial Intelligence."

Mike says he greatly admired Dr Watts. "He challenged me and helped me develop the skills I needed to accomplish my academic goals. He also encouraged me to seek answers and figure things out for myself. We also shared very similar interests academically. I have a great deal of respect for him, and now consider him a friend as well as a teacher and mentor."

Mike was awarded a Māori scholarship for his final year of study and was named valedictorian when he first graduated in 2018. He then went on to achieve very high grades during his post-graduate and master's studies.

He says the support he received throughout his time at AIS was exceptional. "I faced a number of personal and study challenges during my five years at AIS. With the support of the head of programme and some of the other lecturers, I was able to work through the difficulties and ultimately succeed."

Having completed his master's research on the use of Evolving Connectionist Systems in Distributed and Federated Learning, Mike plans to embark on a PhD in the near future. His current AIS qualification has already helped him secure full-time employment.

"I am currently working in transport operations at Booth's Group Auckland. This role involves operations administration, freight control, transport planning, and customer service. Once I have my PhD, I hope to find a niche role in the transport industry leveraging both my IT skills and my transport knowledge.

Heleine Fisi'iahi loves meeting new people and her friendly personality is a natural fit for the tourism industry.

The 26 year-old moved to New Zealand from Tonga in 2018, having previously studied primary and secondary school teaching. She was initially looking to study a bachelor's degree in teaching but once she came across AIS on the internet, she knew it was where she wanted to be.

New Zealand Certificate in English Language (NZCEL)

Having worked as a barista in Australia and Auckland for several years, Kazu Yamashita could speak a little bit of English. But not enough to confidently embark on a diploma or bachelor degree programme of study.

Now the 32 year-old, who is originally from Japan, is studying a Bachelor of Information Technology at AIS, having first completed a New Zealand Certificate in English Language over four months in late 2020.

The Level 4 programme is designed to equip students with the listening, speaking, reading and writing skills necessary in English to then successfully undertake a full-time tertiary programme in New Zealand.

"Once you pass NZCEL, the certificate from this course proves your English level," Kazu explains. "So you can then enter university or other courses elsewhere, depending on which level of NZCEL you take.

Kazu first heard about AIS and their English Language Centre from a Japanese agent. "I was looking for schools so I could change my career and for my visa.

"Most of the students in my NZCEL course had a similar purpose to my own for studying, so it was so easy to make good relationships with them and help each other. It made my time in this course so enjoyable. My teacher was so nice. He was very helpful and kind whenever I went to see him to ask some questions."

Kazu is now interested in becoming a software developer in future. "Because if you have a skill, you can get a job anywhere, not only in New Zealand. My goal is to become a software developer and make my life more stable."

Kazu has no hesitation in recommending AIS to prospective students who want to improve their English language skills. "There are so many students you can be friends with who come from various countries. New Zealand is a country mixed with lots of cultures. When you get a job, you will get an opportunity to work with people from all over the world. So it is really good to study with many international students.



New Zealand has an aging population meaning this is a growth industry which has an increasing need for workers to provide care and support services for the older person, the sick and those recovering from injury or operations.

Healthcare Assistance Strand

- · Have a willingness to work with older people
- · An English level of IELTS 5.0 (Academic or General) (with no band less than 5.0) or equivalent
- 17 years old or over


Note: If you are 20 years of age or over and do not hold the minimum entry requirements you may be eligible to be enrolled where your previous educational, work or life experience indicates you have a reasonable likelihood of success. This will be determined through an interview prior to enrolment.

Other

- Work experience agencies may require health checks before accepting the student on a work placement.
 These requirements are discussed with all potential students at their interview before acceptance onto the programme.
- Applicants may have to undergo police vetting for entry into this programme.

Immigration

Medical and Travel Insurance

International students enrolled for two weeks' duration or longer (including group students) must have appropriate current medical and travel insurance while in New Zealand.

AIS can provide advice on compliant insurance and arrange insurance for you if required.

Eligibility for Health Services

Most international students are not entitled to publicly-funded health services while in New Zealand and may be liable for the full cost of any medical treatment. Full details on entitlements to publicly-funded health services are available through the Ministry of Health, and can be viewed at: www.health.govt.nz.

Accident Insurance

The Accident Compensation Corporation provides accident insurance for all New Zealand citizens. residents and temporary visitors to New Zealand, but international students may still be liable for all other medical and related costs. Further

New Zealand Qualifications Authority

Auckland Institute of Studies is registered by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) as a Private Training Establishment under the provisions of the Education Act 1989 and its subsequent amendments. At its last NZQA review in 2018, AIS received a result of Category 1, with "highly confident" for educational performance and "highly confident" for capability in self-assessment.



Memberships

AIS is a member of a number of industry organisations, including Independent Tertiary Education New Zealand (ITENZ), English New Zealand and the Employers and Manufacturers





Code of Practice

AIS observes, and is bound by, the Education (Pastoral Care of International Students) Code of Practice 2016 and the Education (Pastoral Care of Domestic Tertiary Students) Interim Code of Practice 2019. Employment

International students enrolled in AIS diploma and degree programmes may work up to 20 hours per week and full-time during the summer holidays and semester breaks. Bachelor's degree and postgraduate students also qualify for a three-year post-study work visa after graduation, while graduate diploma and twoyear undergraduate students qualify for a one-year post-study work visa after graduation. In some cases English language students and spouses of graduate students may also qualify for work rights.



Fee Protection

All student fees are held in an independent trust account – Jolly Duncan & Wells Trustees Ltd, AIS Student Trust - managed by an independent Chartered Accountant. Fees are released periodically in arrears on a pro rata basis in relation to tuition delivered, so your fees are protected at all times.

Refund Policy

For international students in programmes over three months, all payments exceeding up to 25% of the fees paid will be refunded if the student withdraws within the first ten working days of the programme. Thereafter, fees paid are non-refundable. The refund policy is in accordance with the Education Act 1989. Full information is contained in the Enrolment Application Form.

Orientation and Enrolment

New students must be present for orientation prior to classes commencing. Absence from orientation can negatively impact on a student's ability to settle into campus and academic life at AIS. Returning students are able to select courses during the second half of the previous trimester.

Enrolment Restrictions

Offering of programmes and courses is subject to minimum enrolment numbers.

Students who fail to make satisfactory progress may have their study programmes restricted. AIS will do all it can to ensure students succeed and make restrictions unnecessary.

International Students

- Apply for your Student Visa online: www.immigration.govt.nz/new-zealand-visas/apply-for-a-visa.
- · Students from China, Vietnam, the Indian Subcontinent and the Middle East are recommended to apply for 'Pre-Visa Assessment' before paying programme fees. In order to obtain your Student Visa, you will need to show our Receipt and Confirmation of Enrolment after you have received an 'Approval in Principle' from Immigration.
- Follow the instructions from Immigration New Zealand to complete your visa application process.
- · Students already in New Zealand can apply online at www.immigration.govt.nz or see the Online Visa Office at the reception counter for assistance.
- · After receiving your Student Visa, please immediately inform the AIS staff member named in your Letter of Offer of your travel details.
- · Students from visa waiver countries coming for short-term courses of up to three months must have an NZeTA (New Zealand Electronic Travel Authority) before travelling to New Zealand. To see the full list of visa waiver countries, visit immigration.govt.nz/nzeta
